



Did You Know?

- Samaritans were a mixed culture— Jewish and Gentile. As a result, the Jewish community viewed Samaritans as unclean and the two didn't interact (John 4:9).
- To cast the Samaritan as the hero in the story, as Jesus did, would've made His point about the nature of God's mercy even more dramatic.
- Jesus was calling the Jewish people to love others radically, leaving behind their preconceived ideas and misconceptions, in order to glorify His kingdom.
